MACBETH LOCAL RULE

Native Areas

If a ball comes to rest up or against a plant located in the native areas or the plant in the native area interferes with the player's stance or swing, the ball must be moved and dropped, without penalty, within one club length not nearer the hole.

PACE OF PLAY

As you know, we continue to do what we can to improve pace of play at the Macbeth. Last year, rounds were taking more than five hours to complete. That is not acceptable to the Committee and we believe it detracts from our event.

Accordingly, we will continue to monitor the pace of play during this year's tournament. Our goal will be to have all teams complete their better-ball rounds in no more than four hours and fifteen minutes, and our Sunday aggregate round in no more than four hours and forty minutes. We will have marshals and our pro shop staff out on the course to help meet that goal.

We still need your help to improve pace of play. Please do what you can to play efficiently and manage your time between shots. Most importantly, please keep pace with the group ahead of you. If one of our marshals or pro shop staff notifies you that your group is falling behind, please do what you can to get back into position as soon as possible. Also, if you find that the group ahead of you is not keeping up with the group ahead of it, alert one of our staff members to the situation so that we can attempt to remedy the situation as soon as possible.

Thanks in advance for doing your part to assist us to improve pace of play at the Macbeth.
