Welcome to the 2022 DIO Implant LA Open at Wilshire Country Club! We are proud to host the world's top-ranked female golfers for a fourth year and to provide a platform to highlight and support women's sports.

Wilshire Country Club celebrated our 100-year anniversary back in 2019. Over the years we have hosted many tournaments, including the Los Angeles Open and PGA Champions Tour events, as well as LPGA tournaments.

We are excited to welcome fans back on-site, as the 2021 Champion, Brooke Henderson, defends her title this week. Wilshire Country Club was founded in 1919 and designed by Norman Macbeth, a native-born Englishman who was inspired by courses in his home country. A defining feature of the course is a natural barranca, which now runs through 13 holes of Wilshire's unique property. Macbeth created a links-style layout containing over one hundred and twenty bunkers strategically located to challenge even the most accomplished of golfers.

Our Defending Champion

Brooke Henderson captured her 10th LPGA Tour title at the 2021 DIO Implant LA Open, with a final-round 4-under par 67 and a one stroke victory over Jessica Korda.

Starting the final day four strokes behind Korda, Henderson shot her second straight 67 that featured a back-nine birdie push to elevate her up the leaderboard down the closing stretch of holes.

"I definitely am a firm believer when you're in the winner's circle you're getting a lot of breaks and it's sort of meant to be," Henderson said. "I was making a lot of birdies, and I think probably the biggest break was 12, that chip-in. You know, those breaks can be really small or they can be really big."

Henderson holed out from 70-feet on 12 for birdie, vaulting her up the leaderboard and giving her momentum to ultimately capture her 10th LPGA Tour title.

Henderson is set to defend her 2021 title this week against an elite international field of the world's best female golfers. 144 players will compete in the 2022 DIO Implant LA open for a share of the \$1.5 million purse. And, for the first time since 2019, in front of fans.




Wilshire Country Club Centennial

One hundred years ago, the city of Los Angeles was on the cusp of tremendous change. The population in 1919 was just 570,000 but the city was filled with men and women possessing great energy, ambition and foresight. The petroleum industry was in its infancy and about to become massive, but the Hollywood silent film industry was already booming, spreading the fame of the Los Angeles area throughout the world. 



Hole Descriptions

Hole 1

Par: 4 Yards: 378


Bunkers come into play on the left and right side so an accurate drive is imperative. The approach shot to the green is guarded by bunkers and it pays to keep the shot low and left of the hole.



Hole 2

Par: 5 Yards: 532

A lengthy hole that calls for an accurate tee shot to carry the bunkers. There is a hidden bunker on the back left of the green, and shots that drift right leave a tricky shot out of a swale.



Hole 3

Par: 4 Yards: 347


Most players will use a hybrid or fairway off the tee to leave a short iron to the green. If the tee shot drifts to the right, the eucalyptus overhang will obstruct the approach shot. All putts move away from the Hollywood sign.

Hole Descriptions

Hole 4

Par: 3 Yards: 170

Features a Biarritz-style green. It is imperative to pull the right club when the pin is on the back portion of the green because a shot that comes up short requires navigating a ridge with a five-foot slope.



Hole 5


Par: 4 Yards: 387

The player can go straight at the green or play it left of a nasty bunker to get a great angle into the green. Approach shots that come up short left will end up tumbling off the green toward the barranca.

Hole 6

Par: 4 Yards: 427

The most difficult hole on the course. Players need to stay below the hole. Also the most difficult green on the course with a severe slope from back to front. There are very few level putts on this green. A four is a very good score.





Hole Descriptions

Hole 7

Par: 3 Yards: 141


A very scenic par three that is well bunkered with numerous tee and pin locations. A bunker protects the front of the green and must be avoided. Watch the downhill speed if players go long on the approach.



Hole 8

Par: 4 Yards: 384

To the right of the green is the Howard Hughes mansion. Katherine Hepburn, who was dating Hughes at the time, would distract his group by sauntering around on the balcony while they were putting.



Hole 9

Par: 4 Yards: 428



Ben Hogan was playing a practice round in the Los Angeles Open and he asked his caddy where to aim his tee shot and the caddy replied, "At the Hollywood sign," and Hogan ever the perfectionist replied, "which letter."

Hole Descriptions

Hole 10

Par: 4 Yards: 370

Avoid the left bunker off the tee and have a short iron into a green that has the barranca and bunkers short and right. A small, square-shaped green that is best to putt from short of the hole for an uphill putt.



Hole 11


Par: 4 Yards: 394

A challenging hole that places a premium on positioning with the barranca on the left and bunkers on the right. Any approach shots left leave a shot out of the hollow, so club selection and direction are key.

Hole 12

Par: 3 Yards: 180



If a tee shot is not squarely hit, the false front comes into play leaving a very challenging pitch to this elevated green. The green is very quick from back to front and is the fastest green on the course from right to left.



Hole Descriptions

Hole 13 Par: 5 Yards: 503

Start the drive right center to avoid the left rough. Pick the proper line down the right side to leave a good angle for the third shot. Avoid the left greenside bunker and back right greenside bunker at all costs.




Hole 14 Par: 4 Yards: 319

The prevailing right-to-left afternoon wind can wreak havoc on the approach shot. A great par four that needs to be treated with respect.

Hole 15 Par: 5 Yards: 528 Aon Risk Reward Challenge

The longest hole on the course boasts the most bunkers. The barranca makes club selection important and the front right and back left pin positions are difficult.



The Aon Risk Reward Challenge, a season-long competition that awards \$1 million to the player with the lowest cumulative score on a designated hole at every event.



Hole Descriptions

Hole 16 Par: 4 Yards: 367

A difficult driving hole so longer hitters may choose a hybrid off the tee. The second shot is to an elevated green with a false front. Yardage is deceptive due to the large bunker short of the green.




Hole 17 Par: 4 Yards: 436

Ranked one of the Top 500 holes in golf. It is always best to aim the second shot at the palm trees just right of the green. A very difficult green to read since it doesn't always break away from the Hollywood sign.

Hole 18 Par: 3 Yards: 156

A great par 3 should be a very exciting finishing hole. The back portion is surrounded by the "Bear Trap" which produces more double bogeys than pars. Pick a line, stay committed and good things await.
